A Widow and Her Daughters

When I was taking photos of the children at the Hope Children's Home in Machilipatnam, the caretaker of the children's home called a teenage girl to write down their names. He told me that this girl had just finished high school, but

ter had also finished high school. They are the daughters of our cook, Esther. He shared with me the story of this family.

Their father worked by pulling a rick-shaw to support the family. They were living in dire need of food and clothes. One day, like any other morning, he left home with his rickshaw to find work, but didn't come home in the evening. His family thought that he probably found some extra work and would be home late, but he never came home. They didn't know what happened to him.

More than a month passed. Then the caretaker of our children's home, Joseph, heard the story and went to the police station to investigate. Since they knew Joseph as a former gang leader, they quickly responded and told him there had been an accident a month ago. Since nobody claimed the body, they had buried him. There were a couple of things that belonged to him so the officer brought Esther to see



brought her two young daughters and admitted them in our home for better care and education. Then she was hired as a cook at the children's home.

When I heard this story, I was really touched. I asked the sisters what they would like to do. They both said that they would like to continue their education. I told them that I would try to help them and asked the caretaker to make arrangements for them to go to college. Then we traveled back to our headquarters in Mori. A few days later he called us on the phone and said that both of them are now enrolled in a college. God is good!

A Child's Journey

Dhayanand was born into a tribal family.



His father was called to preach the Gospel. Because of financial problems, he admitted his son in our children's home in Gopavaram in the jungle area when he was in first grade.

After he finished grade. Dhayanand came to Hope Children's Home in Mori to our headquarters to go to high school. After finishing high school, he attended a college for two years and finished the intermediate course in 2011. Then he wanted to go home and get a teaching job

in a tribal village. (The government makes a special provision for tribal people to get a job if they finish high school). Sure enough, he got a job teaching primary classes.

While teaching, he felt that he should attend a Bible school. He resigned from the job and was admitted into a Bible school. Even though he was still attending Bible school, he wanted to be associated with Hope Ministries and started attending our evangelists' monthly meetings.

When I asked him what caused him to change his mind he said, "I don't know how to explain this. I have a strong desire to preach the Gospel to the many tribal people that have never heard the Good News of Jesus Christ. I felt this is more important than a teaching job." Praise the Lord!

I believe he has a calling in his life to preach the Gospel. Since Dhayanand is from a tribal village, I know that God will use him to turn many tribal people to Christ. Please pray for this young man.

One Believer's Story

A woman became a Christian from a staunch Hindu family. Her teenage daughter also accepted Jesus. I've known this family for a long time. She said how difficult it is for them at home. Her husband is an alcoholic who spends all the money that he earns on alcohol. He doesn't bring home anything to support the family. He is very abusive and beats her. He also hinders the family from coming to church.

However, they are very faithful and strong believers. She was afraid that her daughter couldn't get married because she is a Christian. She asked the church to pray that God would help them find a husband for her. After the believers prayed, they found a good young man who married her. Now both of them are attending church and growing in the Lord.

Believer's Funeral Boycotted by Relatives

Recently one of our believers came home from work and told the family that he wa having pain in his chest. Before they could take him to the hospital, he lay down and passed away. The family wanted to have Christian funeral but the rest of the rela tives wanted a Hindu funeral instead. Since the family refused a Hindu funeral, every body deserted the dead body without burial Then, our pastors and church members had to carry the body to the cemetery and take care of the burial.

An Evangelist's Report From a Tribal Village:

I had the privilege of sitting down with a pastor, Mark, who is working in the state of Orissa. It is one of the difficult states for



Christians. There is a lot of persecution taking place. The pastor said that he belongs to a tribe called Valmeeki. They are known as the smartest of tribal groups. He was born and raised

in a staunch Hindu family who worships many gods and sacrifices animals.

People who live in these tribal villages are very poor and oppressed by the rebels called Naxalites. This group's motto is to rob the rich and help the poor, but it is often the other way around. Most of the time, they help themselves. In the process, they fight with the state and also with the villagers who don't support them.

This pastor said that the rebels arrange regular gatherings at the center of the village to discuss their plans. They will send messengers to let the villagers know about the get-togethers. They demand that everybody attend and threaten those who refuse

to come. After several warnings, they beat them, remove a hand or leg, or sometimes they kill them right in front of the villagers. They do this to intimidate the rest of the villagers into submission. Many villagers are oppressed and killed by this group. Life is very hard for all of the villagers.

It is especially difficult for Christians because of the caste system. Once a Hindu becomes a Christian, he is put in a different caste system by the state and denied any help. It is very hard for Christians to get any kind of job even if they are well qualified. Many Christians are suffering immensely because of their faith in Jesus Christ. On one side, they are oppressed by the rebels and on the other, they are persecuted by the state and Hindu extremists.

Our evangelist said that he walks 10 to 15 miles one way to go to the villages to preach the Gospel. In spite of all these difficulties, we still see many people accepting Jesus as their Lord and Savior.

Some of our evangelists work in tribal areas like these and are going through similar problems. Please pray for these brothers and sisters who desperately need our prayers and financial support.

LAMBADI TRIBE CHURCH GROUP

One of HMI's pastors, Krupanidhi, who works in several villages, shared with me about his ministry among tribal people. He



told me, "I felt a burden to preach to a tribal group, the Lambadis. After many years of visiting these villages and sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ, some of the women accepted Jesus as their Lord and Savior.

"I was warned not to come to their village by Hindus. However, I continued to go there to preach and to pray for the sick people in the village. After God healed some people, they began to see the difference between their gods and Jesus. The women who accepted Jesus are now attending the church service."

They dress very colorfully and wear a lot of bangles on their arms, almost from wrist to elbow. Their dress and customs probably haven't changed for centuries. Please remember these believers and their families in your prayers.
