
Evangelists' Ministry Reports



Life of a Hope Ministries' Evangelist

Evangelists walk or bike every day following narrow paths to reach remote villages, carrying lanterns and drums to draw the attention of the villagers. They work in three or more villages and some pastor more than one church. Hundreds of Hindus have come to know the Lord and 150 churches have been established. Since foreign missionaries are prohibited from preaching in India, native evangelists carry the word of God to the people.

Many different cultures, ethnic groups, and religions are represented within India's borders. Fourteen major languages are spoken. Even though some claim to have thousands of gods, Indians still feel an intense hunger for truth.

Hope Ministries reaches the lost through indigenous evangelists who know the language, culture, and lifestyle. Many of the 300 Hope Ministries evangelists work in tribal villages filled with staunch Hindus who are devoted to idol worship and witchcraft.

Most of HMI evangelists were once Hindus whose lives were radically changed after somebody cared enough to share the Gospel with them. Now they are I came and preached in his church

"I have been preaching the Gospel to the Hindus in several villages. After many years of labor, with the new believers, I started two churches in two different villages. Praise the Lord! **Besides**



pastoring churches, every day I go to the villages and preach the Gospel. We also conduct village gospel meetings at nights at believers' homes. The villagers also attend these



A few weeks later, he came back to church and shared that a few days after he was prayed for, he was completely healed and free of cancer. We are praying for the safety of the new believer and also for the salvation of the villagers.



As you know, we have been working with the state educational department in India to get permission to start a D.Ed. College in addition to what we already have. It has been a slow process with a lot of red tape as always. But praise the Lord that we made some real progress. All the paperwork is done and approved except one department to give us their approval. We hope it is going to happen soon.

The students with two years intermediate course could join this college to get their teaching certification. It is a two year course with 50 students per year. Once they finish this course, they would be eligible to teach in primary schools.
