THIS GOOD NEWS TO BE PREACHED TO THE WHOLE WORLD

With the invention of the printing press, the Gospel began to spread faster than ever before. Then came radio, TV, and now the internet and YouTube, and the Gospel is spreading even faster to the four corners of the world.

It is very good news to all of us. But still there are many people in isolated villages in the remote jungles of India and many other parts of the world who have no electricity, no radios, not to mention no TVs and no communication with the rest of the world. It is very difficult to believe that there are still millions of people who have never heard the name Jesus. Many tribal villages are closed to the outside world and are very hostile to visitors. Many evangelists who go to remote jungle villages to share the Gospel face of lot of difficulties. They don't even know what might happen to them and if they will come home alive.

The word of God says, "And this gospel of the kingdom will be preached in the whole world as a testimony to all nations, and then the end will come." Matthew 24:14 We are happy that the Gospel is spreading, but there is still a long way to go to cover the whole world. If every Christian who has accepted Jesus as their Lord and Savior would take up his cross and follow Jesus' command to seek and save the lost, we will be able to reach the unreached.

Here at HMI, we have a burden to reach the lost. We have been preaching the Gospel by feeding and educating the poor and needy children and teaching them the word of God. Also, we are spreading the Gospel in the highways and byways by supporting native evangelists in India. We are encouraged to hear the field reports of souls coming to know Jesus as their Lord and Savior.

CHANGING WATER INTO LIVING WATER!



Most of the HMI evangelists are preaching the Gospel in remote jungle villages. When they see the living conditions of the villagers, they share with us what they saw. We help the villagers by offering food, clothing, and other necessities. We hear that most of the tribal people have no clean drinking water. The women have to walk several miles in the morning and evening to a canal or a water hole. They carry two or three pots on their head to minimize the number of trips. Sometimes it is very dangerous when it rains. They slip and fall and get hurt.

When the villagers drink polluted water, they get sick with typhoid, malaria, and other diseases. Since there are no hospitals nearby, and no roads or vehicles, they put the sick in a sling and carry them with a bamboo stick. Some are carried

on their shoulders. Tragically, some of the sick die before they get to the hospitals. You may help drill a Bore-well for \$2000.

As God provides, we are drilling bore-wells to provide clean drinking water to people in remote jungle villages. Sometimes it is very difficult for a drilling rig to come to a village because there are no roads. The villagers have to make makeshift roads for a rig to come to their village. When the bore-wells are drilled, we invite all the villagers for a dedication. We dedicate the bore-well by singing a couple of songs, reading the Bible, praying, and sharing the love of Jesus. Afterwards, our evangelists are able to visit the villagers without fear of being attacked. They share the love of Jesus and pray for them and pray for any sick in the village.

TESTIMONIES: We are encouraged to hear some testimonies of the villagers where we have drilled bore-wells. They are grateful for clean drinking water which is helping them to keep healthy, and at the same time they rejoice in knowing the living God. Thank you so much for your generous donations to drill bore-wells.





PERSECUTION: Recently one of our evangelists sent me a couple videos of Christians being beaten by tribal extremists. It was very hard for me to watch them being beaten by a mob. It is happening in many parts of India. Some of our evangelists and believers are also going through some sort of persecution.

Last year, an evangelist was beaten and thrown into the bushes, thinking he was dead. A traveler saw him and brought him out of the bushes. When

the church prayed for this man, God touched and restored his life. He is now back in the streets preaching the Gospel to the tribal people. Praise the Lord! I met this pastor and talked with him where we drilled a bore-well. He is now working with Hope Ministries. Please remember to pray for the persecuted church around the world. Then you will be handed over to be persecuted and put to death, and you will be hated by all nations because of me. Matthew 24:7-9.
